From the Trailside...

Did you know that White Clay Creek State Park has the greatest trail mileage, 40+ miles, of any state park in Delaware? Did you also know that volunteers do the vast majority of trail maintenance (mowing, trimming and clearing of obstructions) in the park? Unfortunately, the state does not have staff to keep all the trails clear and that is where dedicated trail-loving volunteers come into play!

Firstly, we have the Trail Adopters. This is a longstanding group of volunteers who sign-on to take that extra step when they are out enjoying a hike by trimming back over-hanging vegetation, clearing debris, and reporting more significant issues to park leadership so that other skilled individuals can make things right. Typically, a Trail Adopter will agree to keep an eye on a defined piece of trail for the entire growing season while they are out enjoying the park, assuring that they inspect and work their section at least once a month. This group is coordinated by the park's Manager of Volunteers, Ann Burress, who makes sure they have the information and knowledge to keep things looking good for all other trail users.

Secondly, we have the Volunteer Trail Maintenance Crew (VTMC), a group of volunteers created through the efforts of the Friends of WCCSP. This group is now in its third year of effort to keep the trail edges clear by mowing, hedging, and weed whacking. Thanks to the generosity of the Friends of WCCSP, the Wilmington Trail Club, and DNREC, this group is equipped with a Billy Goat self-propelled mower, 4 weed whackers/hedgers, safety equipment, and a trailer for getting the mower to any part of the park. Similar to the Trail Adopters, but a bit more focused on heavy-lifting efforts, volunteers agree to work a defined section of trail for the growing season, keeping trail edges clear so that users do not have to deal with significant overgrowth on the trail edges. This of course makes it easier for various trail users to share the trail without having to step into or ride through multi-flora rose, poison ivy, stinging nettle, etc. while enjoying the trails. Friends Board member Mike Czupryna coordinates the VTMC effort. A third group that does significant effort on the park's trails is the Trail Spinners. This group has been involved in designing, building and maintaining trails throughout the mid-Atlantic region for over 30 years. Though locally their focus is mostly on Middle Run, some Trail Spinner members are part of the VTMC for mowing and trimming, and they are also very knowledgeable in knicking and deberming trails to ensure proper drainage. The Trail Spinners are also closely aligned with local bike shops and other volunteers to manage work parties for focused group efforts throughout the year, assuring that trails are clear and well drained, often times within the state park.

So next time you see someone working hard along a trail clipping, trimming, mowing, knicking, deberming, clearing downfall or otherwise improving the experience for all trail users, don't forget to thank them as they are most likely a volunteer working on YOUR behalf! And remember, you can volunteer too! Contact the park or the Friends of WCCSP and signal your desire to help. If you're not able to make a formal commitment, please be the person who tosses the tree branch off the trail, grab that bit of trash, or remembers to report issues to the park office while out on a hike, walk or ride. Volunteers cannot keep track of everything in the park, so positive feedback on areas of concern is a big help.

We love our trails, but without the efforts of volunteers, our beloved trails would be overgrown and nearly impassable so do your best to support the Friends, volunteers, and park staff so that everyone has a great experience in the park!
