It's almost Fishing Time!

Wondering where you can catch a fish in White Clay?


- The Smith Mill Pond offers accessible docks for bluegill fishing.
- Judge Morris Estate offers a catch-and-release program for largemouth bass
- Anywhere along the White Clay Creek offers anglers the opportunity to fish for stocked rainbow and brown trout.
- Trout fishing opens the first Saturday in April.
- A fishing license is required at all times when fishing.
- A trout stamp is required April through June 30th and again in October through November.
- Fly-fishing is only allowed north of the Chambers Rock Bridge up to the Pennsylvania border.
- The creek closes to all fishing two weeks prior to the opening day of trout season.

In celebration of National Fishing and Boating Week, June 1-9, 2024, the Division has designated June 1 and 2 as free fishing days when anyone may fish in Delaware's waters without a fishing license.

Anglers age 16 and older must still obtain a free FIN number to participate in the free fishing days. Delaware's freshwater trout program is a self-supporting put-and-take fishery in selected New Castle County streams and Kent and Sussex County ponds. Revenue generated from the sales of trout stamps is used to purchase rainbow, brook and/or brown trout for stocking. Summer water temperatures limit trout survival and reproduction in Delaware waters, so stocked fish are meant to be taken, but may be released at the angler's discretion.

Trout season begins the first Saturday in April. The 2024 freshwater trout season in New Castle County opens at 7:00 a.m. on Saturday April 6, 2024, for youth under the age of 16, and one-half hour before sunrise for all anglers on Sunday April 7, 2024. No fishing is allowed in designated trout streams or designated trout ponds (Tidbury & Newton Ponds) two weeks (14 days) prior to the scheduled opening of the trout season. It is unlawful to fish for trout in designated trout streams or designated trout ponds between one-half hour after sunset and one-half hour before sunrise.

White Clay Creek State Park is a great place to fish for trout in the White Clay Creek we also have ponds that have great fishing opportunities at Cattail Pond at Carpenter Recreation area, Possum Hill pond, Judge Morris pond, Millstone Pond near Carpenter Recreation area.
